

BASE COURSE FAQs

Basic Simulation Education Course (BaSE) is a 1 day course. It includes pre-reading and prep that is highly encouraged, as the course day is spent practicing concepts introduced in the pre-reading.

There is no charge for BaSE and it is open to all those interested and engaged in facilitating simulation education. However, the simulation team prioritizes those that are actively engaged in simulation facilitation within IH. This is to foster of safe, effective simulation-enhanced education delivery across the health authority.

- Provide practice for simulation facilitation
