Light Purple Down contaminated with AMB-FUB (Synthetic Cannabinoid) with Fentanyl

Light Purple Fentanyl testing with extremely toxic levels of Fentanyl

Kamloops

December 5, 2019

- There have been recent reports of the light purple fentanyl with toxic levels of fentanyl causing increased overdoses and producing high levels of sedation (lots of nodding).
- There have been recent reports of the light purple Fentanyl producing increased heart rate, heavy sweating and auditory and visual hallucinations.

For your safety:

- Avoid using different drugs at the same time or using drugs and alcohol together.
- Don't use alone. Leave door unlocked. Tell someone to check on you.
- Test by using a small amount, then go slow.
- Carry a Naloxone kit and know how to use it.
- Use at an overdose prevention or supervised consumption site if one is near you.

Know the signs of overdose and how to respond

- Recognize the signs of an OD: slow or no breathing, gurgling or gasping, lips/fingertips turning blue, difficult to rouse (awaken), non-responsive.
- Call 9-1-1 immediately
- Open airway and give rescue breaths
- Give naloxone (Narcan) if you have it.
