Mental Health & Substance Use Services

We invite you to connect with our Access Services program at your local Mental Health & Substance Use Centre for more information and links to mental health or substance use services that best meet your needs.

Crisis & Hospital Services

Responds to people experiencing an acute mental health or substance use crisis with the primary focus to engage with and connect clients to service.

We respect your right to privacy. We will ask you about involving your family in your care. Sharing information and working with your family and care providers will ensure you receive the best care.

Crisis Response

Specialized team who responds to the hospital (acute care and emergency departments) and community locations to provide urgent assessment, intervention and referral.

RCMP Partnership Teams

These teams, consisting of a Mental Health and Substance Use clinician and RCMP officer respond to mental health and substance use emergencies in the community.

Crisis Response Teams and RCMP Partnership Teams provide crisis intervention, including assessment and linkages to appropriate community and hospital resources for those experiencing an acute mental health crisis. These services may involve collaborative approaches across a number of community services and may be based in the hospital or community.

Substance Use Connections

Mental Health and Substance Use clinicians support people who use substances in both hospital and community settings. This priority response is dedicated to patients who present with/or are at risk of overdose. Services may include:

- Short term follow up to support seamless linkages to community based addictions care
- Referrals to Opioid Agonist Therapy
- Liaison with Addiction Medicine Consultation Services
- Assessment & treatment support
- Safe discharge planning from hospital settings



Addiction Medicine Consultation Services

Provides services for people with substance use disorders while in emergency departments or during a hospital stay. A physician with a specialty in addiction medicine is part of the health care team and guides evidence based treatments.

Aboriginal Patient Navigator Services

Aboriginal Patient Navigators work in hospitals throughout Interior Health. They are available to support Aboriginal patients and their families during their care, whether or not they wish to self-identify as Aboriginal. The goal of an Aboriginal Patient Navigator is to help make a patient's care and journey to wellness safe, comfortable, and less confusing and less stressful.
