# Thyroid Biopsy After Care

## **After your Thyroid Biopsy**

- You may experience tenderness at the biopsy site. This should resolve in a few days.
- You may have a small amount of swelling and/or bruising at the site.
- If you have bleeding from the biopsy site, apply steady pressure with a gauze pad.
- Any time we put a needle into the body; there
  is the potential of introducing infection. Watch
  for redness, swelling, pus or discharge from the
  biopsy site.
- To ease discomfort, keep your head raised on a pillow when you are lying down and support the back of your head and neck as you sit up from a lying position.
- If you have a sore throat; use throat lozenges or gargle with warm salt water.

# Caring for your Biopsy Site

- Keep the bandage on your biopsy site for a few hours.
- There are no restrictions following this procedure.

#### Results

- Results are usually available within I to 2 weeks.
- You will get the results from your doctor. If you are not notified within 2 weeks, contact your physician to discuss the findings.

### **Medications**

- If you have pain after the biopsy, take acetaminophen (Tylenol®) if able, or as directed by your physician.
- Avoid taking nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) for 24 hrs as they can increase bleeding.
- If you take medications to thin your blood (such as aspirin or other anticoagulants), the performing radiologist or your physician/specialist will advise when you can resume. Continue all other medications the same day unless otherwise specified.

## Call your Doctor or Nurse if:

- Fever, chills, flu-like symptoms or feeling generally unwell
- Increased bleeding from the biopsy site
- Difficulty swallowing
- Drainage, redness, swelling or pain at the biopsy site
- New swelling to lymph nodes in your neck
- You have any questions

Outside office hours if you feel you need immediate medical attention, go to the nearest Emergency Department.
