Kamloops

Counterfeit Dilaudid tablets contain a fentanyl analog



Looks Like: Dilaudid tablet - 8/H / APO

Sold as: Dilaudid/Dillies/Hydromorphone

Contains: N-propionyl parafluoronorfentanyl
(a fentanyl analog)

Risk: High risk of overdose

In effect until: July 31st 2025

**Check your
drugs before
using!**

This is a counterfeit (fake) tablet sold as Dilaudid. It does not contain hydromorphone. It contains an unknown amount a drug related to fentanyl. Using illicit tablets is not recommended due to the heightened risk of overdose. Be aware of risk of fakes, if not purchasing from a pharmacy.

If you have a drug that looks like this, get it tested before using.

Consider these additional tips if you are going to use drugs

- Find drug checking locations at www.drugchecking.ca
- Carry naloxone and know how to use it.
- Be aware of risks if mixing with other drugs, including alcohol.
- Use with others around when possible.
- Start with a very small amount and space out your doses.
- Get the LifeGuard App - lifeguardddh.com.
- Call 211 or visit bc211.ca to find services near you.
