



DRUG ALERT Nelson

DOWN contains fluorofentanyl, ketamine and benzodiazepine

Looks Like:	Pink Chunks, Powder, Pebbles	
Sold as:	Down, Dope, Fentanyl	
Contains:	Fluorofentanyl Ketamine Benzodiazepine (unspecified)	
Risk:	High risk of overdose and fatal overdose Dizziness, dissociation and confusion Nausea, amnesia, sleepiness, nodding out Smoking is not safer than injecting	for a long time

Ketamine is a dissociative anesthetic. In higher doses, it can cause immobilization, loss of body control, dizziness and hallucinations.

The combination of fluorofentanyl, ketamine and benzodiazepines can lead to significant sedation. Overdose symptoms may last beyond administration of naloxone.

Consider these additional tips if you are going to use drugs

- Find more drug checking locations at www.drugchecking.ca
- Be aware of risks if mixing with other drugs, including alcohol
- Use with others around or at an Overdose Prevention Site
- Start with a small amount and wait before taking more
- Space out your doses
- Carry naloxone and know how to use it
- Call 211 or visit bc211.ca to find services near you
