Kelowna

Oxycodone tablet contains fentanyl

Looks Like: Oxycodone 20mg tablet

Sold as: Oxycodone / Oxy

Contains: Fentanyl or analog 

Risk: High risk of overdose



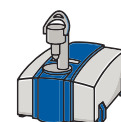
This is a counterfeit (fake) tablet sold as oxycodone. It does not contain oxycodone.

Fentanyl is up to 75 times stronger than oxycodone. The quantity of fentanyl (or analog) in these tablets is unknown and can vary from one tablet to another.


Using illicit tablets is not recommended due to heightened risk of overdose. Be aware of risk of fakes if not purchasing from a pharmacy.



Have a tablet that looks like this? Call or text 250-212-0137 or 250-869-7870 to get it tested before using. Drug checking is available in person 1-9 Mon-Fri at Kelowna Outreach Urban Health SCS.



Consider these additional tips if you are going to use drugs

- Find more drug checking locations at www.drugchecking.ca
- Be aware of risks if mixing with other drugs, including alcohol
- Use with others around or at an Overdose Prevention Site
- Start with a small amount and wait before taking more 
- Space out your doses
- Carry naloxone and know how to use it
- Call 211 or visit bc211.ca to find services near you
