



DRUG ALERT

Vernon

Percocet tablet contains fentanyl

Looks Like: White tablet with “TEC” on it

Sold as: Percocet / Percs (oxycodone and acetaminophen)

Contains: Fentanyl or analog 

Risk: High risk of overdose



This is a counterfeit (fake) tablet sold as Percocet (oxycodone and acetaminophen). It contains fentanyl or fentanyl analog.

Fentanyl is up to 75 times stronger than oxycodone. The quantity of fentanyl (or analog) in these tablets is unknown and can vary from one tablet to another.

Using fake tablets is not recommended due to heightened risk of overdose. Be aware of risk of fakes if not purchasing from a pharmacy.



Have a tablet that looks like this? Call or text 778-212-8611 to get it tested before using. Drug checking is available in Vernon from 9-5 Mon-Fri and 10-4 Sat-Sun at the Medicine Shoppe Pharmacy.



Consider these additional tips if you are going to use drugs

- Find more drug checking locations at www.drugchecking.ca
- Be aware of risks if mixing with other drugs, including alcohol
- Use with others around or at an Overdose Prevention Site
- Start with a small amount and wait before taking more 
- Space out your doses
- Carry naloxone and know how to use it
- Call 211 or visit bc211.ca to find services near you
