Counterfeit dilaudid contains cychlorphine

Looks Like: White Dilaudid tablet - 8 | DD

Sold as: Dilaudid / Dillies / Hydromorphone

Contains: Cychlorphine 

Risk: High risk of overdose

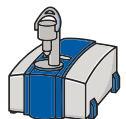


This is a counterfeit (fake) tablet sold as Dilaudid. **It does not contain hydromorphone.** It contains **cychlorphine**, an opioid approximately 10x the potency of fentanyl.

Using illicit tablets is not recommended due to the heightened risk of overdose. Be aware of risk of fakes, if not purchasing from a pharmacy.



Have a tablet that looks like this? Call or text 250-212-0137 or 250-869-7870 to get it tested before using. Drug checking is available in person 1-9 Mon-Fri at Kelowna Outreach Urban Health SCS



Consider these additional tips if you are going to use drugs

- Find more drug checking locations at www.drugchecking.ca 
- Be aware of risks if mixing with other drugs, including alcohol
- Use with others around or at an Overdose Prevention Site
- Start with a small amount and wait before taking more
- Space out your doses
- Carry naloxone and know how to use it
- Call 211 or visit bc211.ca to find services near you
