Rural Leadership Development Program

The Rural Education Action Plan (REAP) is currently accepting applications for the Rural Leadership Development Program. The purpose of this program is to increase opportunities for rural physicians to pursue leadership training and develop the skills and abilities to help bring system improvements that will benefit British Columbia's rural populations.

Rural physicians who are pursuing formalized leadership training may apply for up to \$15,000 to cover expenses. In addition to this, participants are offered a mentoring opportunity with a rural leader through UBC CPD's Rural Physician Mentoring Program. Physicians may apply if they have been practicing in an RSA Community for at least nine months of the past year and if they have letters of support from their health authority and community. Applications are accepted twice/year - the next deadline is April 30, 2022.

THE RURAL VIRTUAL ECHOCARDIOGRAPHY RESEARCH PROJECT

A collaborative effort between the University of British Columbia's Faculty of Medicine (UBC), Providence Health Care, and the Rural Coordination Centre of BC (RCCbc). Co-led by Drs. James Liu, Rob Moss, and John Pawlovich, the goal of this project are to advance equity in access to healthcare for rural BC citizens. This project will focus on healthcare providers and patients in rural communities with limited access to conventional echocardiogram examinations. The project design will include echocardiography education for rural providers along with point-of-care imaging and examination protocol. A cloud-based image sharing platform will be used to share the studies conducted in the community with a specialist in St. Pauls' Hospital in Vancouver, BC, where a final report will be generated and the results transmitted back to the rural provider from where the echo study originated to inform and support patient care.
