2.1	Medical Health Office Report 2021: Toxic Drug Crisis in B.C.'s Interior Region (Part 1)	Dr. Sue Pollock and Dr. Karin Goodison presented on the toxic drug crisis in BC's interior region. This report fulfils a statutory duty to report on the health of the population within the Interior region, specifically related to the worsening toxic drug crisis. 3.1	President & CEO	<ul> <li>Susan Brown, President &amp; CEO provided an update that included:</li> <li>On May 25, Interior Health made a presentation to the Select Standing Committee on Health. All BC health authority CEO's were requested to make a presentation on the work their health authorities are doing around the toxic drug crisis. Interior Health (IH) presented on the hub and spoke approach being implemented across the region, the strong partnership with the Bill Nelems Pain and Research Centre, as well as the preventive work being doing with the school districts.</li> <li>On May 23 she participated in the memorial of Le Estcwicwéy (<i>The Missing</i>) to honour the 215 children and support residential school survivors and intergenerational survivors.</li> <li>The NAVIG8 graduation ceremony took place on April 21. NAVIG8 is a unique program to IH to support emerging medical leaders across the region.</li> </ul>	
3.2	Board Chair	<ul> <li>Chair Doug Cochrane provided an update that included:</li> <li>Health authority board chairs meet regularly with the Minister of Health, Adrian Dix and the Minister of Mental Health and Addictions, Sheila Malcolmson. The chairs will be meeting with Minister Malcolmson in the near future to receive an update on the toxic drug crisis presentations that came forward to the Select Standing Committee on Health.</li> <li>The Health Professions Act is being updated and there will be changes to the standards for all health care professionals.</li> <li>The BC Patient Safety Quality Council (BCPSQC) holds an annual Quality Forum each year that is attended by health care professionals from across the province. Dr. Devin Harris, Executive Medical Director, Quality and Patient Safety for IH is the Chair. Each year, the BCPSQC recognizes individuals</li> </ul>	



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who have made a significant impact to improve the lives of patients and families through the BC Quality Awards. Interior Health is proud to report two staff members that were recognized: Dr. Harsh Hundal, Executive Medical Director, Physician Engagement and Resources planning was the winner of the award for Leadership in Quality, and Dr. Glenn McRae, Executive Director, Quality and Patient Safety was the runner-up for the Quality Culture Trailblazer award.
