

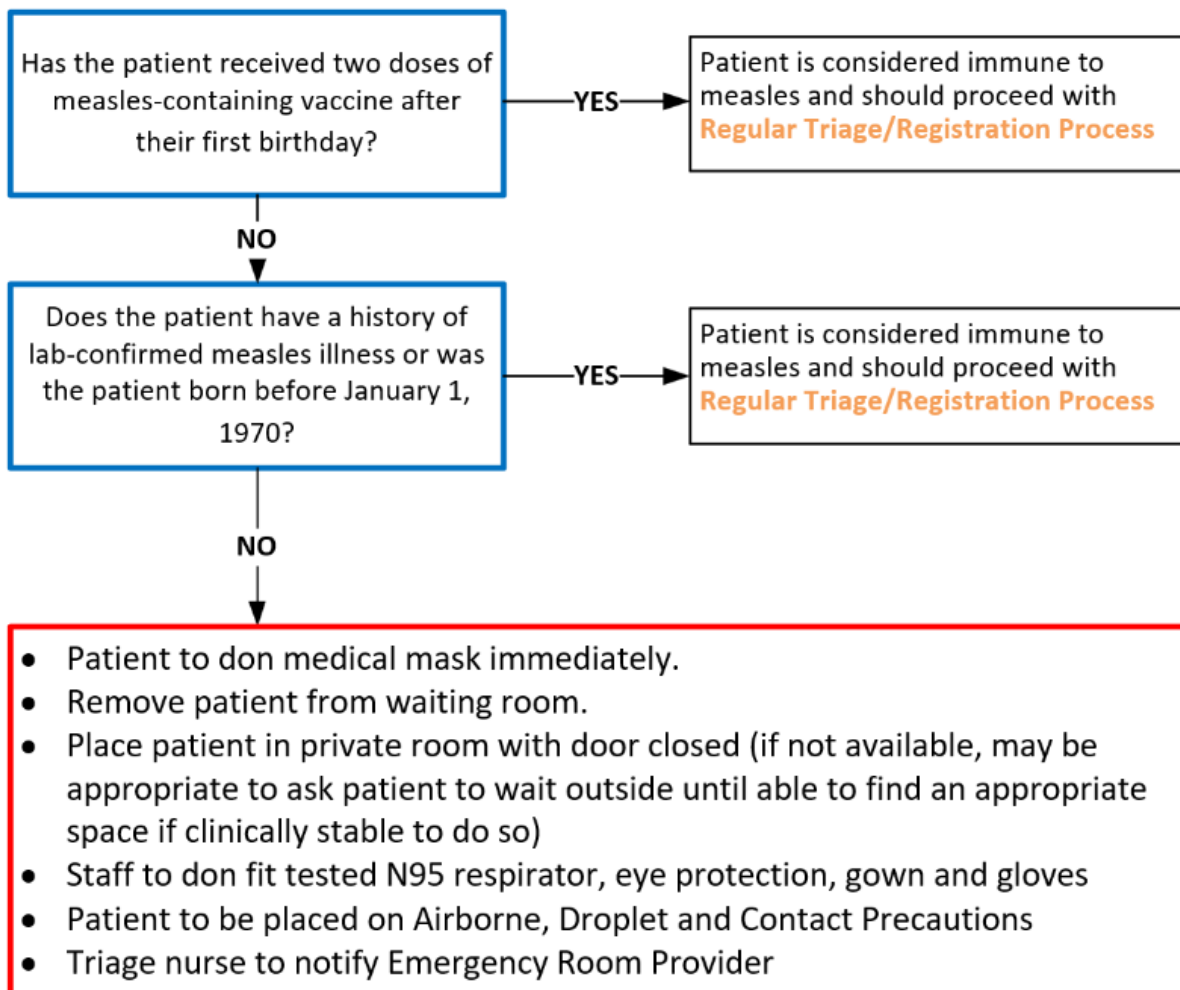
Emergency Department Initial MEASLES Screening

A **PRINTED** copy of this guideline may not be the most recent version.

Pre-Triage/Triage Nurse ask the patient if they have experienced the following:

1. *High Fever ($\geq 38.3^{\circ}$), **AND***
2. *Cough, or runny nose, or red, watery eyes.*
3. **Followed by:** *Red blotchy rash that begins on the head and spreads down to the trunk, arms, and legs. Measles rash onset occurs 3-7 days after symptom onset.*

If “yes” to 1 and 2 (as rash may or may not be present at initial presentation), nurse to ask the following questions:
