Pathways to Impact: **Refreshing Canada's Strategy for** Patient-Oriented Research (SPOR) March 2025

Since its inception in 2011, Canada's Strategy for Patient-Oriented Research (SPOR) has worked to embed the priorities of people and communities into health research, and to embed patient-oriented research evidence into policy and practice, to improve health experiences and outcomes. Recognizing that much has changed in our health systems and health research ecosystem, CIHR and SPOR partners conducted a pan-Canadian engagement in 2023-24 to invite feedback on what is working well and what might need to change to ensure that the SPOR research investment is aligned with evolving health system and health research realities while reflecting the priorities of people and communities with lived experience, researchers, and health system decision makers. Ideal applicants will have some understanding and involvement in improvement initiatives and/or formal training in quality improvement through programs such as the Clinician Quality Academy, Physician Quality Improvement or IHI Improvement Advisor initiatives. The Colin & Lois Pritchard Foundation Student Enhancement Endowment Fund, the goal of the program is to strengthen collaborative research activity between UBC Okanagan, Interior Health and BC Cancer (Kelowna) through shared research projects.

Applications must articulate the student's role in the project, how the clinical collaborator will be involved, and how the project supports and strengthens collaborative research between the organizations.
