In Plain Sight Response—Annual Update

Nov. 30 marked five years since the release of the In Plain Sight: Addressing Indigenous-specific Racism and Discrimination in B.C. Health Care report.

The 2020 investigation found extensive examples of racism and discrimination against Indigenous patients and resulted in the In Plain Sight (IPS) Report – the <u>full report</u> and a <u>data report</u> – published in November 2020 and February 2021 respectively. IPS made 24 recommendations to be implemented within and integrated into the B.C. health-care system in response to Indigenous racism.

This **fifth** IH <u>In Plain Sight Response Report</u> takes a deeper look at what has been learned and where change must be strengthened.

Publication Alert for the Community-Led Action for Resiliency Important Throughout Youth (CLARITY) Project

The CLARITY project is a **community-driven initiative**, building resilience among the youth to prevent suicide. CLARITY challenges conventional perspectives of suicide, commonly conceptualized as an isolated and person-level problem, by emphasizing the impact of systems, structures, spaces, and relationships on the well-being of young people. The project actively engages the community, tapping into their lived and layered experiences to inform interventions that go beyond individual-level solutions. The latest CLARITY publication is officially out and open access: <u>'Resilience is action taken together':</u>
<u>Results of a dialogue-based study on community factors shaping resilience in the context of youth suicide prevention.</u> This publication anchors CLARITY's core resilience framework — belonging, connection, and social climate — and Table 1 in the paper offers an accessible summary of these three community-level concepts.

Coming Soon: two manuscripts currently under review (one on the World Café and community-driven directions, and one on the ROYC Partnership Charter), and another nearly ready to submit outlining our vision for CLARITY 2.0 — a research and knowledge-mobilization hub to build youth capacity for civic engagement and public influence.

Applications Now Open for the Health Quality BC Quality Academy

Applications are now open to participate in Quality Academy starting in April 2026! For more than a decade, Quality Academy has supported health care professionals from across the province to strengthen their ability to lead meaningful change. With over 800 alumni, the community continues to grow, bringing new leaders and new ideas to improving care every day.

Delivered over a six-month period, Quality Academy consists of three in-person residency sessions and a mix of online classes and learning activities. During your time in the program, you will apply new skills and knowledge to lead improvement projects, learn from expert instructors, and pair up with mentors for individual coaching and support. You'll also have the opportunity to work on a sponsored project from your organization that addresses one or more dimensions of quality, based on the Health Quality Matrix.

New this year, program registration costs (\$5500 + tax) will include tuition and travel (flights/km and hotels) for the three in-person residencies held throughout the province. This shift in our fee structure reflects our commitment to ensuring equitable access to HQBC learning programs no matter where participants live in the province.

UBC Faculty of Medicine's Summer Student Research Program (SSRP) is now accepting applications!

The deadline to submit student-supervisor applications is Friday February 13, 2026 at 3pm PST. The SSRP is a competition open to MD (Years 1 and 3) and non-MD undergraduate students registered at UBC. It provides funding for a summer research project supervised by a member of the Faculty of Medicine (FoM). Funding of up to \$3200 is provided in the form of a student stipend; supervisors are responsible for all other expenses. Applications are submitted by student-supervisor teams. To be eligible, supervisors must have a current faculty appointment (instructor or higher, including clinical) in the FoM at UBC. This includes affiliate FoM appointments.
