Program and service highlights

Expanded services at Ashcroft UPCC support team-based family care

Alongside its existing urgent care services, the Ashcroft Urgent & Primary Care Centre (UPCC) has stepped up to offer teambased family primary care, providing support for everyday health needs, from regular check-ups to follow-up visits. Care is provided by physicians, registered nurses, an Indigenous Patient Navigator and allied health professionals.

Kamloops Complex Care Housing expands to help more clients with complex needs

The first phase of complex care housing in Kamloops is close to being fully filled, providing stable housing and 24/7 wraparound support for individuals with overlapping health challenges. Interior Health and BC Housing are expanding this program with a new 20-unit facility at 1100 Glenfair Drive, which is anticipated to open in 2027.

Community Health Planning Table seeks diverse voices

Each community has unique health-care needs. Interior Health is striving to work with local Divisions of Family Practice, municipalities, First Nations and other partners to collaboratively address the causes of health issues and guide the development of inclusive, actionable solutions. This work is currently being planned at community tables in locations such as Ashcroft and Lillooet.

Number of nurses hired on the rise

For the fourth year, IH increased the number of new graduate nurses hired. Approximately 900 new grad nurses have been onboarded since 2023. In the Thompson Nicola Region, 83 graduates have been hired in the past year including 19 licensed practical nurses and 64 registered nurses.

Community partnerships bring more hospitalists to Royal Inland Hospital

Since April 2025, Royal Inland Hospital has seven signed offer letters for new hospitalists, helping to strengthen the care team for admitted patients. Interior Health worked closely with the RIH Foundation and Venture Kamloops to facilitate site visits so that new physicians were well-connected with the hospital and the community.



Rural and remote communities welcome Return-Of-Service family doctors

Barriere welcomed Dr. Mark Akangoziri, a family physician who joined the community in 2025 through a three-year return-of-service (ROS) agreement, part of the Practice Ready Assessment BC physician program. Interior Health continues to recruit physicians to rural communities such as Lillooet, Logan Lake, and Ashcroft through this program and the International Medical Graduate initiative, and work with local partners to support retention. Transforming Care: Interior Health's Major Investments Strengthen Services in Thompson Nicola

Interior Health has integrated significant health-care investments in the Thompson Nicola Region over the past five years, including capital and operational investments including:

- Royal Inland Hospital Phil & Jennie Gaglardi Tower (\$490.6 million)
- Kamloops North Shore Urgent and Primary Care Centre (\$4.7 million)
- Building capacity in and expanding mental health and substance use services and programs (\$28.7 million)
- Surgical investments (\$36.1 million)

Expanding Cancer Care

In partnership with BC Cancer, Interior Health is expanding cancer care in Kamloops through a new \$386-million cancer centre and upgrades to existing oncology services at Royal Inland Hospital. Once open, the new centre is expected to provide radiation treatment for over 1,000 patients in its first year. It will also provide an additional MRI machine for cancer detection and diagnosis. <u>Visit engageih.ca to follow the development process</u>.

Imaging upgrades improve care in Lillooet, Clearwater

Hospitals in Lillooet and Clearwater both received upgrades to the X-ray system this year, which improves patient care by producing faster and more high-quality images for diagnostic. Barriere will welcome upgrade to its system in early 2026.

Accessibility improvements support patients in Merritt

Interior Health is expanding eight patient washrooms to accommodate lifts and provide space for staff to assist patients safely and comfortably. Four washrooms are currently under construction.

Patient communication technology updated in Lillooet

Communication between patients/residents and health-care team in the Lillooet hospital and long-term care home will improve thanks to new nurse call systems in patient rooms.
