#### WHAT ARE HEALTH AUTHORITIES?

In BC, health authorities govern, plan, and deliver healthcare services within their geographic areas. They are responsible for identifying population health needs, planning appropriate programs and services, ensuring programs and services are properly funded and managed, and meeting performance objectives. The five regional health authorities in BC are Interior Health (IH), Fraser Health, Island Health, Vancouver Coastal Health, and Northern Health.



Interior Health is located in the Southern Interior of British
Columbia. IH serves a large geographic area covering
almost 216,000 square kilometers and includes larger cities
as well as a multitude of more rural and remote communities.
The health authority is split into four areas which include Thompson
Cariboo Shuswap, Okanagan, Kootenay Boundary, and East Kootenay.

# AS A NON-BC STUDENT, CAN I COMPLETE MY CO-OP / STUDENT PLACEMENT WITHIN BC?

#### DOFS INTERIOR HEALTH OFFER RELOCATION ASSISTANCE?

We want to make it easy for you. Permanent and temporary placements may be eligible for financial relocation assistance to help you and your family with the move. It is a program to facilitate recruitment of qualified candidates to external permanent and temporary vacancies. Details should be discussed with the hiring manager or clinical recruitment specialist prior to accepting the offer and any relocation provided will require a 24-month return of service. Casual hires are not eligible for this program.

# I SAW A JOB POSTING THAT INCLUDED **RURAL RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION PROGRAM** UNDER INCENTIVES? WHAT IS IT?

The IH Rural Recruitment and Retention Program is a lump sum of \$10,000 on the day of hire and is applicable to RNs who make an employment commitment to hard to fill permanent vacancies located in the interior of British Columbia. This incentive is offered to RNs in rural and remote communities. Details should be discussed with the hiring manager or recruiter prior to accepting the offer.

#### WHAT IS THE CANADA STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM?

The Government of Canada offers Canada Student Loan forgiveness to eligible family doctors, residents in family medicine, nurse practitioners, and nurses who work in under-served rural or remote communities that lack the primary health care they need. This change will help more Canadians get the health care they deserve.

If you are a nurse or nurse practitioner and you qualify, you could receive up to \$20,000 in Canada Student Loan forgiveness over a maximum of five years (\$4,000 per year).

#### WHAT IS BC'S WAGE COMPARED TO MY HOME PROVINCE?

For registered nurses, JobBank.gc.ca has a chart that compares provincial registered nurses prevailing wage ranges in Canada. The median wage per hour in BC is \$41 per hour according to JobBank.gc.ca.

## DO OUT OF PROVINCE NURSES HAVE TO BE REGISTERED WITH THE BC COLLEGE OF NURSES AND MIDWIVES?

Yes, in order to work in BC, you must have provisional or practicing registration with the B.C. College of Nurses and Midwives (BCCNM) prior to beginning employment.
