WHOLE COMMUNITY PALLIATIVE ROUNDS

What is the Purpose?

The purpose and goal of Whole Community Palliative Rounds are to provide weekly, integrated communication and clinical expertise for person and family-centered care needs among the Circle of Care. It allows a whole care continuum team to work collaboratively to review goals, symptoms and recommendations for care management.

Who is the Focus?

Persons and families:

- with transitioning or unstable physical symptoms (ESASr ≥4+)
- with complex psychosocial, emotional, spiritual health or financial symptoms or needs (ESASr ≥4+)
- whose current care management of symptoms is ineffective
- who require an interdisciplinary care plan approach
- transitioning between sectors and require planning and communication from a whole community approach.

What is the Process?

- Acknowledge individuals who have died during the past week
- Provide a succinct report on the person's care-related issues
- Discuss the current symptom burden and care-related issues
- Adjust the Plan of Care and communicate to the person's local health care team
- Communicate symptom management recommendations back to the person's MRP if not in attendance (WCPR Physician Leader role)

Facilitator Role

- Share expectations and goals with team members
- Manage Meditech sources and complete WCPR documentation
- Implement proper local documentation tools during or immediately after rounds
- Invite external health professionals to provide expertise and knowledge
