"JUST IN CASE" KIT What is the "Just in Case" Symptom Management Kit?

The kit is a contingency parenteral medication kit in Home Health for individuals with a palliative performance score (PPS) of 40% or less. It is individualized to each person's needs and implemented for symptom management. The kit contains 72 hours of parenteral medications to immediately alleviate symptom distress while following up with a request for a regular prescription for continued use at home. This avoids unnecessary transfer or admission to the hospital for symptom management.

Initiating the Symptom Management Kit

- Screening
 - Individuals with a PPS of 40% or less, or are rapidly declining are considered eligible for a symptom management kit.
 - After the Home Health nursing team evaluates the list of criteria to determine client eligibility, they will ask <u>five openended questions regarding storage of the kits and potential</u> <u>risk of misuse</u> to the individual and family.
- Ordering
 - Physician/NP completes the *Just in Case* prescription form (#821469)
- Teaching to person/family includes:
 - Administration
 - Purposes
 - Precautions
 - Self-storage
 - Need for the kit to be used only by nurse, physician, nurse practitioner or paramedic, unless instructed otherwise
 - How to use the in-home medication record
 - Review of medications for symptom management

Activation of the Symptom Management Kit

Activation of the kit is by a Home Health Nurse, Physician, NP or Paramedic. The Nurse will be in contact before and upon activation to provide caregiver education. *Nurses refer to the <u>Pre Drawing</u> <u>Medications for Palliative Care: Home Health Guideline</u>

PRACTICE TIPS 💭

WHY?

• Support Home Health clients at home when it is their Goal of Care, and avoid hospital visits.

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- Decrease barriers and delays in timely symptom management.
- *Provide backup or contingency medication plan* (not meant to replace regular prescriptions).
- Align parenteral medication options with the <u>BC Palliative Symptom</u> <u>Management Guidelines</u>.
- *Support best practice* in home-based Palliative Care.

Who is involved?

- Home Health Nurse, Physician, Nurse Practitioner (NP), Pharmacist, Paramedic, individual and family.
 - Access the <u>Palliative Just in Case (JIC)</u> <u>Symptom Management Kits (SMK)</u> <u>Standardized Process</u> to find the description of your role and others.

<u>Community Pharmacist</u> role:

- Fill the medications prescribed in the "Just in Case" kit
- Provide <u>Palliative "Just in Case"</u>
 <u>Medication Kit Information</u> to individual
 and caregivers
