PROGRAM SUMMARY



REGIONAL PERINATAL SPECIALTY PROGRAM (RPSP)

The Interior Health Regional Perinatal Specialty Program (RPSP) is a blended learning model that supports RNs to work in the perinatal environment (within their respective/defined scopes). The IH Maternal Newborn Child and Youth Network and the Professional Practice Office have jointly approved the program to satisfy the advanced preparation required to work within the perinatal specialty.

The RPSP utilizes a blended learning model with systematic integration of online and face-to-face learning. The goal of the Interior Health (IH) Regional Perinatal Specialty Program (RPSP) is to prepare Registered Nurses to provide safe, competent, professional, and patient centered care in the perinatal setting, at a competent novice level by the end of the program.

The program uses standardized, evidence informed online curriculum offered by the Association of Women's Health Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses (AWHONN). Additional evidence informed theory includes STEP 2 Education – Breastfeeding Essentials and Managing Obstetrical Risk Efficiently (MoreOB). *Current Fetal Health Surveillance (FHS) and Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) within 2 years.

RPSP has three components: theory, education weeks, and preceptorship.
