Influenza Vaccine

<u>Influenza vaccine eligibility</u> has been expanded to include **anyone who wishes to reduce their risk of influenza**. Universal eligibility is provincially determined on a year-to-year basis.

Publicly funded <u>FLUZONE® High-Dose Quadrivalent</u> vaccine is only available for those for 65 years of age and older who live in long-term care, assisted living and First Nations communities.

<u>FLUAD® (Trivalent)</u> is only approved & publicly funded for those 65 years of age and older.

NOTE: Clients 65+ who have received a standard-dose of flu vaccine this season are **not** eligible for a second dose. Only children 6 months to \leq 9 years are eligible for a second dose of vaccine if it is the first time they have had flu vaccine.



ORDERING: Use the Provider Order Form for Publicly Funded Influenza Vaccine.

NOTE: Pharmacists will receive direct delivery via internal processes and do not need to order using this form.

Pneumovax®23 Eligibility

Pneumococcal Polysaccharide Vaccine (Pneumovax®23) is publicly funded for adults 65 years and older as a **one-time dose**. Booster doses provided as a **once-only** revaccination 5 years after the initial immunization are only available for those with specific health conditions. ORDERING: Use the <u>Publicly Funded Vaccine Order Form</u> to order Pneumococcal or other publicly funded vaccines.

School Immunizations

If you have been asked to provide missed school immunizations, we've got your back!

Emergency Departments: We're not out of the woods yet!

Age Appropriate Tetanus

Emergency Departments: Td is not the appropriate product to provide to children even though Td vaccine is approved for those 7 years of age and older. Age-appropriate tetanus toxoid containing vaccine should be used according to age and immunization history.
