Book a Pharmacy Appointment: Pharmacists are an important part of your health care team and offer a wide variety of services in more than <u>1.400 community pharmacies</u> throughout B.C. You can <u>book an appointment</u> or <u>walk-in to an available pharmacy</u> to discuss your minor ailments and contraception needs.

Register to find a family doctor or nurse practitioner (HealthLink BC): If you live in British Columbia and need a family doctor or <u>nurse practitioner</u>, register for the <u>Health</u> <u>Connect Registry</u>.

Check Your Symptoms (HealthLink BC): Understanding common health concerns and what can be done to prevent or treat them can go a long way towards reducing the stress you feel when it comes to your health and the health of those in your care.
