TO: Contracted partners

On October 21, 2021, the Ministry of Health announced a public health order (PHO), the <u>Hospital and Community (Health Care and Other Services) COVID-19 Vaccination Status</u> Information and Preventive Measures.

This letter provides further clarity on the vaccine requirements as applied to contractors:

The following contractors **are included within the scope** of the <u>Hospital and Community</u> <u>Vaccine Mandate</u>, and must be fully vaccinated by Oct. 26, 2021.

- A) Contractors that regularly (defined as at least once a month) provide care or services in a care location are included in the vaccine mandate and need to be vaccinated, including:
 - Contractors that provide service in areas where patients/residents/healthcare providers are present, (e.g., dietary, kitchen, housekeeping or maintenance services).
 - Contractors who come into our sites regularly (defined as at least once a month), e.g. for regular maintenance activities.

The following contractors **are exempt from, or not included within the scope** of the <u>Hospital and Community Vaccine Mandate:</u>

- A) Contractors working in a location outside B.C., who do not regularly (defined as less than once a month) work inside or outside of a care location or facility.
- B) Contractors who work remotely within B.C. and who do not regularly (defined as less than once a month) work inside or outside of a care location or facility.
- C) Contractors who work in a care location or facility occasionally (defined as less than once a month).
- D) Contractors who attend a care location or facility on a one-time basis (e.g. to fix a boiler or clean up a flood). Every effort should be made to keep these contractors separate from patients and health care workers, including masking and physical distancing.
- E) Contracted construction workers who are working in a location or capital project that is entirely separate from patients/residents/healthcare providers (e.g. barriers, hoarding, outdoor sites). Facilities including washrooms and food services must be accessible outside of the care location.
- F) Vendors or suppliers who are not present at care locations. If a vendor determines that their particular situation may be impacted, e.g. if they are on-site at a care location regularly (defined as at least once a month), they should notify Supply
